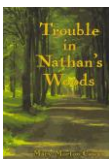


Can you match these words with their meanings?

Armistice	A cook's helper, especially in a lumber camp
Bunkhouse	Sudden outbreak of a disease. In this story, the term refers to the 1918 influenza, which became a pandemic. It started in February 1918, and lasted a little more than two years, killing about fifty million people.
Cant dog	Offensive term for a German, especially a German soldier in World War I or II
Cookee	A building with sleeping quarters, some-times including a mess hall, kitchen, and store
Epidemic	To drag a log to a yard or landing. Horses did the pulling.
Espionage	A truce; a temporary agreement in which both sides agree to stop fighting. On November 11, 1918, the Allies and Germany agreed to end warfare in World War I. Terms of permanent peace were then negotiated.
Filly	A place in the woods where logs were piled, to be later hauled to a landing
Hun	A young female horse
Log hauler	A person who drives teams of horses
Teamster	A pole with a hook, (dog) and a spike at the end; a lumberman's basic tool for rolling logs. Sometimes called a peavey, after Maine blacksmith, Joseph Peavey, who improved the original tool.
Twitch	Practice of spying, or use of spies to gain information about plans of an enemy
Victrola	A crawler tractor with sled runners in front, used to pull sleds of logs coupled together like a train.
Yard	A special phonograph made by the Victor Talking Machine Company. The horn was inside a two-door cabinet, and the doors could be opened or closed to adjust volume.



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
